Short Bio

Diango Hernández (b. 1970, Sancti Spíritus, Cuba) lives and works between Düsseldorf and Milan.

Together with Francis Acea, he co-founded Ordo Amoris Cabinet (OAC), an artistic duo that quickly gained international recognition, exhibiting widely across Europe and North America.

Since relocating to Europe in 2003, Hernández has developed an internationally recognized multidisciplinary practice spanning painting, sculpture, installation, design, and architecture. His work explores themes of memory, migration, identity, and political transformation, often informed by his experience of exile and cultural displacement.

In recent years, his artistic language has evolved through Olaismo, a conceptual framework centered on the metaphor of the wave as a symbol of fluidity, movement, and historical change.
